“Lord teach us to pray...”

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,
Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in
heaven,
Give us this day our daily bread
And forgive us our trespasses,
As we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not
into temptation
But deliver us from every evil. Amen.

Do you pray? Does your faith in God have any meaning in your life? Are you a grateful person? Are you a sinner?

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, and the Readings for this Sunday helps us to reflect on our baptism and its effects. We are called “children of God” by the virtue of the Sacrament of Baptism, indeed yes we are. In the Holy Name of the Blessed Trinity, our mortal body is clothed in the holiness of God.

Our parents, God-parents, siblings, families and friends celebrate the special day of our new life as God’s children.

Some of us were not aware of our own baptism. Yet, whenever we witnessed a baptism of a child in our faith community, it reminds us exactly of how we were baptized. We thank our parents. Their faith brought us to know and experience the love and life of God.

INFANT BAPTISM: Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held quarterly. Call the parish office to for next scheduled date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

ANNULMENT PROCESS: If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.
