Make me whole again, Oh God [2 Kings 5:14-14; Ps 98:1, 2-3, 3; 2 Tim 2:8-13; Luke 17:11-19]

Helen was away from the Church for quite a while. Her parents are not really religious so they didn't attend Church regularly. One day as they returned home from the Flea Market, a truck ran through their minivan killing her parents and her brother and paralyzing her.

Doctors did not think Helen would survive through the surgery but she did. While she was in the hospital, she was visited by chaplains and members of Saint Vincent de Paul's Society. She realized from their conversations and spiritual prayers something she missed in her life. She was grateful to God for the gift of her life, her parents and brother. She was baptized, received Holy Communion and was confirmed into the Church. Helen's witness in her life is that she is being made whole again by the Lord.

Our Lord is faithful to us even when we stray and lose our way. He is merciful and full of compassion. As the First Reading from 2 Kings, the Second Reading from St. Paul to Timothy and the Gospel today reiterates for us the virtues of faith and gratitude.

Living in God's life is always peaceful even the world around us is not. Our faith in God carries us through and it is a light to our feet to see things clearly. Sometimes our sins blind us and it becomes a scarlet red that we are losing our way back to God. Yet, Jesus reveals to us God His Father through His words and teachings so that we will learn to be grateful and give thanks for all that God blesses us with.

Don't be like the nine lepers, who are ungrateful and ignorant. We must all be like Naaman, who opened his eyes and his heart to the instruction and guidance of the holy prophet of God, Elisha.

We need healing. We need an ongoing refreshment of our faith in the well-spring of the living water of life who is Lord, Jesus Christ. Like Helen, we need to make whole again in the life of God.

We need to gain consciousness to receive purity, holiness, and life in the Spirit of God. Material life and indifference leads us astray to the darkness that enslaves us. Live a life that is simple and founded in God alone that brings us peace and happiness.

See you at Sunday and weekday Mass. Let us be always grateful to God for His life, challenges and blessings on us. Remember, Holy Mass is our Thanksgiving to our God for the Sacrifice and His utmost love He offered for us on the Cross. We must be grateful and faithful to God who loves us unconditionally. Amen.
